Scripture readings on the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity are about a love that abides. The Most Holy Trinity celebrates the fullness of God's love for us. It is celebrated the first Sunday after Pentecost so that we can all pray that the Grace of the Lord Jesus Christ, the Love of God, and the Fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with us all.

At the centre of the mystery of God is his everlasting love and fidelity. Regardless of the response of the world, our response, the constancy of God's love is very difficult to grasp: a love that continues to be faithful even when it sees continued infidelity in those it loves. God's ceaseless love of the world is so great that he sent his beloved Son among us. The Son's faithful love is great that he faced the ultimate infidelity – being put to death by those he loved. But God's love survives the death of Jesus: God raised his Son and sent his Spirit so that we could share the very life of the love of God. God is love. In honouring the Trinity today, we *celebrate the awesome stubbornness of God's extravagant love for our world, for all of us.*

It is of the nature of God that his love abides forever. And if there is one thing we all ache to experience in our lives, it is the love we can depend on, the love that is not withdrawn when misfortune comes, the love that sees beyond our frailty and faults because it sets no limit to forgiveness. Let us pray on this solemnity of the fullness of God's love that we never grow out of it.

Eucharistic Ministers' renewal of their commitment. This will take place next weekend, on the feast of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ – Corpus Christi.

The Novena will run from this **Saturday 23 May** to the **Feast of the Visitation (Sunday 31 May)**.

Consultation on proposal of St Anne's Primary School to join St Joseph Catholic Multi Academy Trust and for the school to convert to Academy status.

In April 2026, the archdiocese of Liverpool set out its renewed Strategy for the Development of Catholic Multi Academy Trusts – A Family in Christ: Our Future Together. The strategy responds to the Government's White Paper – 'Every Child Achieving and Thriving', and the key education priorities particularly surrounding inclusion, community engagement, attainment and improving outcomes. The government has set its expectations that all state funded schools should join or form a Trust – moving towards a Trust led system and strengthening local collaboration.

Schools across the archdiocese have been organised into three Trusts geographically. Our school is part of the group of St Helens schools which will join St Joseph Catholic Multi Academy Trust.
